



The Fight for India's Wildlife

Prerna Singh Bindra is one of India's leading nature-writers, and a conservation journalist with over 1,500 pieces to her name. She also writes books for children. Prerna has been at the forefront of the battle to conserve India's wildlife for over a decade. She has served as a member of India's National Board for Wildlife Committee (2010-13), and other policy-making boards. Prerna's primary focus is on protecting wildlife habitats and critically endangered species. She also writes travelogues and occasional humorous pieces. Prerna's book *The Vanishing: India's Wildlife Crisis*, published by Penguin India, was released in June 2017 to wide critical acclaim.

Prerna will be speaking on India's endangered wildlife, how its conservation is rooted in India's culture, and the history of Indian nature writing, as a guest of the MA in Creative Writing and the Research Centre for Environmental Humanities on Tuesday October 29th, 6pm to 8pm, at Bath Spa University's Newton Park campus, in the Commons building, room G24. **Admission free.
